**NOTICE OF DECISION: UNDER SECTION 24A
OF THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1982**

I refer to your request of 9 March 2020 to the Department of Health (department), seeking access under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (Cth) (FOI Act) to the following documents:

If this study was not done, please explain why it wasn't carried out."

I am writing to advise you of my decision.

Decision

I am authorised under section 23(1) of the FOI Act to make decisions in relation to Freedom of Information requests. I am writing to notify you of my decision on your request.

All reasonable steps have been taken to find the documents referred to in your request including a thorough and extensive search and consultation with the relevant policy and program areas.

Thorough searches have been conducted of:

As a consequence, I refuse your request for access to the documents referred to in your request pursuant to section 24A of the FOI Act.

Review rights

If you are dissatisfied with my decision, you may apply for an internal review or Australian Information Commissioner (Information Commissioner) review of the decision.

Internal review

Under section 54 of the FOI Act, you may apply in writing to the department for an internal review of my decision. The internal review application must be made within 30 days of the date of this notice (or such further period as the department allows). Where possible please provide reasons why you consider review of the decision is necessary. The internal review will be carried out by another officer of this department within 30 days.
